Deuteronomy 14:2 (NKJV), "For you are a holy people to the Lord your God, and the Lord has chosen you to be a people for Himself, **a special treasure** above all the peoples who are on the face of the earth."

Ephesians 4:22-24 (AMP), "That, regarding your previous way of life, you put off your old self [completely discard your former nature], which is being corrupted through deceitful desires, and be continually renewed in the spirit of your mind [having a fresh, untarnished mental and spiritual attitude], and put on the new self [the regenerated and renewed nature], created in God's image, [godlike] in the righteousness and holiness of the truth [living in a way that expresses to God your gratitude for your salvation]."

There comes a time when we need to set ourselves apart for a season of prayer and fasting to hear what the Lord is saying specifically. The word "consecration" simply means "dedicated to a sacred purpose; set apart." Prayer and fasting are simply a way to say, "Jesus, for the next few days, I want to be set apart for you for Your purposes." Not many people talk about fasting... quite the contrary. Almost every other commercial on TV has us looking at tantalizing fast food that will be sure to cause our taste buds to dance! Yet, when we read the Bible, we find Jesus Himself even saying things like, "And whenever you are fasting, do not look gloomy and sour and dreary like the hypocrites, for they put on a dismal countenance, that their fasting may be apparent to and seen by men. Truly I say to you, they have their reward in full already. But when you fast, perfume your head and wash your face..." (Matthew 6:16-17 AMP) Notice He uses "Whenever" and "When..." not "If" you fast.

Fasting joined with prayer can do some seriously amazing things. Like crazy God things. Fasting without prayer is nothing but a hunger strike and those do not move God in any way, shape or form. So as you prepare to take this journey with us, get ready, because... well... you'll see! Happy fasting!

Quick Thoughts about Fasting:

- Don't broadcast your fasting... sure, you will need to tell your family and perhaps a few close friends for accountability sake, but try to keep it between you and God as much as you can. **Matthew 6:17-18** says, "But you, when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, so that you do not appear to men to be fasting, but to your Father who is in the secret place; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you openly." (NKJV)
- Be absolutely intentional when you pray daily. In other words, have a specific time where you sit down with God and give Him your complete full attention. Have a note book

handy 'cuz He just might speak to you! Schedule it in your day planner... after all, you have an appointment with the King!

- You are going to get hungry... it's just the way it is. And the more sugary drinks you consume will make the hunger pains worse! Lots of water and good 100% juices will be far better for you! If you reduce your sugar intake and drink plenty of water and good stuff, the hunger pains actually go away! About after day five...
- You can do it! God is calling and He will give you all the strength and perseverance you need!
- Don't be surprised at the increase of spiritual warfare... the LAST thing the enemy wants is for you to pray and fast!! Here are some great verses to throw his way when he starts up:

1 John 4:4 (NKJV), "You are of God, little children, and have overcome them, because He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world."

James 4:7 (AMP), "So be subject to God. Resist the devil [stand firm against him], and he will flee from you."

John 8:44b (NKJV), "...he was a murderer from the beginning, and does not stand in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaks a lie, he speaks from his own resources, for he is a liar and the father of it."

- **2 Timothy 1:7** (AMP), "For God did not give us a spirit of timidity (of cowardice, of craven and cringing and fawning fear), but [He has given us a spirit] of power and of love and of calm and well-balanced mind and discipline and self-control."
- The breakthroughs more times than not usually occur **after** the fast. Do not get discouraged!!



Day 1: Dedication

January 13

Starting a fast is always an interesting thing to do... you know you are going to be not eating, you are dreading the coming hunger pains, every commercial on TV is your FAVORITE thing to eat, and you are hoping to just make it to the finish line! I want to encourage you that you are not alone in feeling this way! Setting yourself apart to pray and fast is a daunting challenge but with the Holy Spirit's help, it can be a very life changing experience! You can do it!

Paul states in **Romans 12:1** (Amplified Version of course) "Therefore I urge you, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies [dedicating all of yourselves, set apart] as a living sacrifice, holy and well-pleasing to God, which is your rational (logical, intelligent) act of worship." Intentionally dedicating yourself for the Lord's purposes is not only awesome, it is also considered an act of worship that is well pleasing to God! Just as singing, tithing, raising our hands... dedicating yourself to the Lord is equally an act of worship! So for the next ten days, you are going to be entering into ten days of worship before God, worship that is well pleasing to Him... just think of what Jesus might have in store for you!

Prayer:

"Jesus, I dedicate the next ten days to you through prayer and fasting as an act of worship. I ask for your help Holy Spirit as I am fasting... may my worship be well pleasing to you! Thank you in advance for speaking clearly to me!"

Action:

• Take a look at what consumes your time through the day. **An honest look**. Is there room for the Lord throughout your day for prayer and Bible reading that you may know Him more? Write out an hour-by-hour list of what you do during the day and **prioritize** your time with Jesus... you will be amazed what a difference that will make in your life!

Day 2: Cleansing

January 14

Psalm 51:6 (NKJV), "Behold, You desire truth in the inward parts, and in the hidden part You will make me to know wisdom."

Psalm 51:10 (NKJV), "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me."

One of the things I have noticed in an extended fast is the fact that all the "yuck" in my life starts to surface. Like a rock thrown into a perfectly clear, calm pond, once the rock hits the bottom, clouds of silt start to rise! This is normal... especially when you are in a process of setting yourself apart for the Lord's purposes. Let God begin to shine His light into the dark places of your life... He desires to heal and cleanse those places!

As the Holy Spirit reveals things to you, write them down and pray about each of them specifically. Is there any person you need to call and right a wrong? Is there something the Lord would have you do to heal a broken relationship? Restoration is something that can do amazing things in the Kingdom... be open in this time of fasting and prayer to whatever He will gently reveal to you!

Prayer:

"Holy Spirit, shine your light on my heart... all the dark places... and wash me. Help me to have the courage to make right the things that need to be made right. Jesus thank you for your cleansing blood!"

Action:

Make the call, send the text, get together with the one the Lord would have you be restored with. Yes, it may be difficult, humbling, and and awkward, but the freedom on the other side is worth it! Watch what the Lord will do!

Day 3: Fire

January 15

1 Kings 18:36-39 (NKJV), "And it came to pass, at the time of the offering of the evening sacrifice, that Elijah the prophet came near and said, "Lord God of Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, let it be known this day that You are God in Israel and I am Your servant, and that I have done all these things at Your word. Hear me, O Lord, hear me, that this people may know that You are the Lord God, and that You have turned their hearts back to You again." Then the fire of the Lord fell and consumed the burnt sacrifice, and the wood and the stones and the dust, and it licked up the water that was in the trench. Now when all the people saw it, they fell on their faces; and they said, "The Lord, He is God!"

"He makes His ministers a flame of fire. Am I ignitable? God deliver me from the dread asbestos of 'other things.' Saturate me with the oil of the Spirit that I may be a flame. But flame is transient, often short-lived. Canst thou bear this, my soul – short life? In me there dwells the Spirit of the Great Short-Lived, whose zeal for God's house consumed Him. 'Make me Thy Fuel, Flame of God.'"

Wesley's reply was, 'I set myself on fire and people come to watch me burn.'" Am I ignitable? Have I been saturated with the dampness of this world, or the oil of the Holy Spirit? Fasting and prayer can make your life extremely ignitable...

Prayer:

"Lord I ask for your fire to fall on my life and consume anything that is not of You!"

Day 4: Pleasure

January 16

1 Corinthians 2:9 (AMP), "But just as it is written [in Scripture], 'Things which the eye has not seen and the ear has not heard, and which have not entered the heart of man, all that God has prepared for those who love Him [who hold Him in affectionate reverence, who obey Him, and who gratefully recognize the benefits that He has bestowed]."

Psalm 16:11 (NKJV), "You will show me the path of life; in Your presence is fullness of joy; at Your right hand are pleasures forevermore."

Yes. Pleasure. There are superior pleasures to be found in God... the fullness of joy of His presence, His word, the companionship of His spirit, the whispers of His heart, peace that passes *all* understanding, revelation, understanding and knowledge of things to come, the beauty of knowing Him as He truly is, and countless more. Just *one* of these would be enough, but there is an infinite supply of pleasures to be found in Him! Yet, all too many times we find ourselves entangled in counterfeit, inferior worldly pleasures... and when we pursue the inferior pleasures of this world, according to scripture we can become enslaved, are forced to serve and become in bondage to those pleasures!

James 4:4 (AMP) says, "You adulteresses [disloyal sinners—flirting with the world and breaking your vow to God]! Do you not know that being the world's friend [that is, loving the things of the world] is being God's enemy? So whoever chooses to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God." If I am a friend of the lusts and pleasures of this world, if I am ensured by affections for these worldly pleasures, if I promote the inferior pleasures of this world by my actions, I am hostile towards God, I oppose God and I am a hateful foe of Him James declares!

What pleasures truly draw my heart? Am I drawn to the superior pleasures of the Lord, or the decaying pleasures of this world?

Prayer:

"Oh God, search my heart... deliver me from anything I may be ensnared by of this world! I want to know the superior pleasures of Your heart!"

Scripture Reading:

- Psalms 149
- Psalms 37

Action:

Walk through your home... hand in hand with the Holy Spirit and ask Him if there is anything in your home that would grieve His heart. Anything that would invoke you to pursue pleasures contrary to the superior pleasures of God. If He reveals something, be ruthless... do what it takes to be free of it!



Day 5: Worship

January 17

John 4:23-24 (NKJV), "But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for the Father is seeking such to worship Him. God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth."

Romans 12:2 (NKJV), "And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God."

It is important to take note of the things that God is interested in! The Bible clearly says He is seeking after, He is requiring, He is craving and desiring TRUE worshippers of Him! God is looking for people who worship Him with the aid of the Holy Spirit, literally *partnering* with the Holy Spirit and the truth founded in His written word! God is desiring worship and adoration from those who are aligned with the Holy Spirit and ARE BEING cleansed and transformed by the washing of the word of God, who are no longer conformed to this world but have been renewed in their minds! However the inverse is true as well... if I am not aligned with the Holy Spirit, and have not been cleansed and transformed by the washing of the word of God and I am still conformed to this world and not renewed in my mind, according to scripture, am I a true, veracious and sincere worshipper of God?

1 Peter 1:15-16 (AMP) states, "But like the Holy One who called you, be holy yourselves in all your conduct [be set apart from the world by your godly character and moral courage]; because it is written, "You shall be holy (set apart), for I am holy." God does not place a requirement on our lives to be holy without the power and ability to do it! He does not ask us to be transformed with out the means to be able to accomplish it!

You see, He has been in the transformation business from the beginning.

Prayer:

"Jesus, help me be a true worshipper of You!"

Scripture Reading:

- Isaiah 61
- I Peter 1

Action:

Worship is so, oh so much more then singing songs in church... even telling someone about Jesus is an act of worship! Who could you bless and share the good news of Jesus with today? Ask the Holy Spirit to place an opportunity before you to share the gospel with! He will do it! Don't be shy, be a light to someone and bring them out of darkness!



Day 6: Transformation

January 18

Romans 12:2 (NKJV), "And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God."

Ephesians 5:25b-27 (AMP), "...Christ also loved the church and gave Himself up for her, so that He might sanctify the church, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word [of God], so that [in turn] He might present the church to Himself in glorious splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing; but that she would be holy [set apart for God] and blameless."

"Why is it that some Christians, although they hear many sermons, make but slow advances in the divine life? Because they neglect their closets, and do not thoughtfully meditate on God's Word. They love the wheat, but they do not grind it; they would have the corn, but they will not go forth into the fields to gather it; the fruit hangs upon the tree, but they will not pluck it; the water flows at their feet, but they will not stoop to drink it. From such folly deliver us, Oh Lord. . . ."

The Gospel is **ALL ABOUT** transformation... from start to finish, it is all about once being lost and now being found... being blind and now being able to see! It takes a renewing of the mind by the daily washing of the word and it takes the Holy Spirit! It takes a submission to the both of those things to experience a true, authentic transformation! **2 Corinthians 5:17** (AMP) declarers, "Therefore if anyone is in Christ [that is, grafted in, joined to Him by faith in Him as Savior], he is a new creature [reborn and renewed by the Holy Spirit]; the old things [the previous moral and spiritual condition] have passed away. Behold, new things have come [because spiritual awakening brings a new life]." God so desires our hearts to be TRANSFORMED! But... so much of modern ministry is centered on behavior modification rather than transformation. In this season of fasting and prayer, we are asking for our hearts to be transformed by the power of the Holy Spirit! Transformation is supernatural!

Prayer:

"Holy Spirit, transform my heart... give me a new heart and put a new spirit within me, and remove the heart of stone from me and give me a heart of flesh!"

Scripture Reading:

- John 8
- Psalms 29

Action:

How much of our lives are actually in sync with the heartbeat of God? We can do things our way or His way. Make a list of three things you can bring into alignment with heaven... for example: My thought life, my relationships (do they move towards God or pull me away from Him) and my free time. Is Jesus glorified in all these things? If not, do what it takes to align them to His heart!



Day 7: Revival

January 19

Welsh Revival Testimony:

"In September of that 1904, when, at the close of a meeting, evangelist Seth Joshua called people to the altar and spontaneously prayed, "Lord, bend us." The prayer struck the heart of Evan Roberts, who had long been praying for revival. As Roberts knelt at the front, he prayed fervently, "Lord, bend me." "I felt ablaze with a desire to go through the length and breadth of Wales to tell of the Savior," Roberts said. "And had it been possible, I was willing to pay God for doing so."

Famous preachers of the day had little success. Nothing that focused on an individual succeeded. Roberts' sermons became briefer and briefer throughout the revival. F.B. Meyer told of a lengthy meeting, powerfully anointed of God, in which Roberts spoke a total of seven minutes.

Miners and their families repeatedly packed chapels, often to more than double seating capacity. One such meeting began at 4 p.m., after the miners finished their workday. Roberts didn't arrive until 7. He pressed through the crowd and offered one word in Welsh, which meant, "Let us pray." God moved upon those gathered, and at 9 Roberts left to pray the rest of the night in his room. The meeting continued until 2 a.m.

Services were never advertised. When some traveler would arrive and ask, "Where is Evan Roberts?" the response would be, "Find the nearest church. **God will be there**."

Without revelation, without a Divine awakening of the heart to the reality of the majesty of this transcendent, uncreated God, with only an informational grasp on the One who spoke and the world was, self pride will run rampant. Are we willing to cry out "Lord bend me?" Are we burning with a desire to go the length and breadth of our communities to tell of the Savior?

Prayer:

"Lord bend me... revive my heart with the fire of YOUR passion to see those who are in desperate need of you come to Jesus! Use me oh God!"

Action:

Gypsy Smith (1860 – 1947), a famous revivalist was once asked how to have a revival. His reply was, "Do you really want to see a revival begin? Then go back to your home and draw a circle around you on the floor. Then get down on your knees in the middle of the circle and ask God to convert everybody inside that circle. When you do that, and God answers, you are experiencing the start of revival!" What can you 'draw a circle around' in prayer and ask God to fill it with a manifest touch of His Spirit? Take a piece of paper and write out those things and draw a circle around them and PRAY FOR GOD TO MANIFEST HIMSELF TO EVERYTHING IN THAT CIRCLE!



Day 8: God's Burden

January 20

On October 8, 1871, the famed preacher Dwight L. Moody was drawing his sermon to a close in a large church in Chicago. His message that night was "What will we do with Jesus which is called Christ?" Instead of praying the prayer of salvation with many, he instructed them to take this new knowledge home, turn it over in their minds, then return the next Sabbath day to decide what to do with Jesus who is called Christ. He then turned to the soloist, who came up and began to sing a song to close the evening. The song began like this:

To-day the Savior calls; For refuge fly; The storm of justice falls, And death is nigh.

The soloist never finished his song, for outside the church a great clamor of bells and the rush of fire engines cut him off. Thus begun the Great Chicago Fire, which destroyed the church that D. L. Moody preached his sermon in that night, along with about 3.3 square miles of Chicago. At least 300 people died in the fire that night, and to his dying day Dwight L. Moody referred to his decision to tell the people to wait before accepting Christ his 'biggest blunder.' He said this: "But I want to tell you of one lesson that I learned that night which I have never forgotten, and that is, when I preach, to press Christ upon the people then and there and try to bring them to a decision on the spot. I would rather have that right hand cut off than to give an audience a week now to decide what to do with Jesus."

John Piper one said this: "Hell is the most appalling reality we can imagine. No horror of suffering in history can be compared to what John calls the "lake of fire" and where Jesus said "their worm does not die and the fire is not quenched" (Mark 9:48). To go through life distrusting and disobeying the infinite God, is an infinite sin and will be punished with eternal torment." **2 Peter 3:9** (AMP) declares, "The Lord does not delay [as though He were unable to act] and is not slow about His promise, as some count slowness, but is [extraordinarily] patient toward you, not wishing for any to perish but for all to come to repentance!" Dare you ask to share the burden of the heart of the Lord?

Prayer:

"Lord... forgive my lack of compassion for the lost. Forgive my inaction for sharing the good news of the Gospel. Help me to bold proclaim you no matter what!"

Action:

Ask the Holy Spirit specifically to Gove you an opportunity to share the good news of Jesus with **TODAY**. Then when the opportunity presents itself, do it! Watch what the Holy Spirit will do!



Day 9: Warfare

January 21

Luke 8:22-25 (NKJV), "Now it happened, on a certain day, that He got into a boat with His disciples. And He said to them, "Let us cross over to the other side of the lake." And they launched out. But as they sailed He fell asleep. And a windstorm came down on the lake, and they were filling with water, and were in jeopardy. And they came to Him and awoke Him, saying, "Master, Master, we are perishing!" Then He arose and rebuked the wind and the raging of the water. And they ceased, and there was a calm. But He said to them, "Where is your faith? And they were afraid, and marveled, saying to one another, "Who can this be? For He commands even the winds and water, and they obey Him!"

Luke 8:26-27 (NKJV), "Then they sailed to the country of the Gadarenes, which is opposite Galilee. And when He stepped out on the land, there met Him a certain man from the city who had demons for a long time. And he wore no clothes, nor did he live in a house but in the tombs..."

"On a certain day..." Could it be the Father's attention was drawn to the torment of a tortured soul and **immediately** commissioned His Son to set this man free? Sometimes what is not said is so powerful! This account of the storm raging against the disciples and a sleeping Jesus took place on their way to the country of Gadarenes! There was immediate warfare against them as they were on their way to set a man tormented by demons set free! Warfare can absolutely serve as confirmation of adherence to the perfect will of God! I am sure during this fast you have experienced your share of warfare... be encouraged... the warfare is confirmation that you are on the right track!

1 John 4:4 (NKJV), "You are of God, little children, and have overcome them, because He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world!"

James 4:7 (AMP), "So submit to [the authority of] God. Resist the devil [stand firm against him] and he will flee from you!"

Prayer:

"Thank you Lord for your protection over my family... thank you that in You we have the authority to resist all attacks and assignments against us in Jesus name!"

Scripture Reading:

I John 4 John 10

Worship Song:

I Put on Christ

Action:

Write down the top two areas in your life where the enemy seems to have gotten a foot hold... could be lust, or anger or whatever the Holy Spirit brings to mind. Once you write them down, pray in agreement with these verses over those situations:

James 4:7 (AMP), "So be subject to God. Resist the devil [stand firm against him], and he will flee from you."

John 8:44b (NKJV), "...he was a murderer from the beginning, and does not stand in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaks a lie, he speaks from his own resources, for he is a liar and the father of it."

Day 10: Encounter

January 22

"Woe is me! for I am undone; because I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips: for mine eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts," expresses the feeling of every man who has discovered himself under his disguises and has been confronted with an inward sight of the holy whiteness that is God. Such an experience cannot but be emotionally violent."

Isaiah 40:25-26 (AMP), "To whom then will you compare Me that I would be his equal?" says the Holy One. Lift up your eyes on high and see who has created these heavenly bodies, the One who brings out their host by number, He calls them all by name; because of the greatness of His might and the strength of His power, not one is missing."

Isaiah 55:8-9 (AMP), "For My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways My ways," declares the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are My ways higher than your ways and My thoughts higher than your thoughts."

The God we serve is so far beyond what we can comprehend. He is transcendent which means "Going beyond the limits of ordinary experience: far better or greater than what is usual: exceeding usual limits: surpassing: extending or lying beyond the limits of ordinary experience: being beyond comprehension" (Merriam Webster).

God doesn't just possess mercy He is abundant in mercy! (Psalms 103:8)
God isn't just great His greatness is unsearchable! (Psalms 145:3)

God doesn't just love His love reaches to the very heavens! (Psalms 36:5)

God doesn't fit in a box The very heavens cannot contain Him! (II Chronicles 6:18)

God doesn't just provide enough He provides more than enough! (2 Corinthians 9:8) God isn't just mildly concerned His compassions never fail! (Lamentations 3:22)

God didn't just give a ransom He gave everything! (John 3:16)

Have you had a violent encounter with the God who spoke and creation was?

Romans 11:33-36 (AMP), "Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are His judgments and decisions and how unfathomable and untraceable are His ways! For who has known the mind of the Lord, or who has been His counselor? Or who has first given to

Him that it would be paid back to him? For from Him [all things originate] and through Him [all things live and exist] and to Him are all things [directed]. To Him be glory and honor forever! Amen!"

Prayer:

"Lord I want to know you, I want a greater revelation of you... an encounter that destroys every false idea I have of You! I ask for more of you!"

Day 11: God Conscience

January 23

One of my favorite examples from history is the revival that fell on the island of Lewis of the Hebrides Islands from 1949-1953 where God used a man by the name of Duncan Campbell.

Duncan Campbell's words: "In revival, God moves and suddenly the community becomes God conscience. An awareness of God, the fear of God grips men and women in such a way that now and again work has to be given up and people give themselves to waiting upon God. This awareness of God to me is the supreme characteristic, the supreme feature of a God sent revival. It'll interest you to know that of the hundreds who found Jesus Christ at that time, seventy-five percent of them were gloriously saved before they came near a meeting, before they heard a single sermon from myself or from any other minister in the parish! The power of God was moving, the Spirit of God in operation and the fear of God was gripping the souls of men. That is a God sent revival, as distinct from special efforts in the field of evangelism."

Men's hearts were AWAKENED; they became GOD-CONSCIENCE.

Think for a moment how non-God conscience we are throughout our day... We may come into a church service and have wonderful times with the Spirit of the Lord except we leave that service with the mindset of "Time to go and live our 'real' lives now."

One night during the revival around 3:30am, Duncan Campbell was called one night to address a group of people who had spontaneously gathered at a police station and were crying out to God for mercy... people had rose from their beds, not able to sleep because they had been gripped by God, in an awareness of God and in a spirit of conviction...

Churches all throughout the parish were constantly full, having to do 4 meetings a night for such was the hunger for God, 7pm, 10pm, midnight and 3am... every day!

One of the defining moments of the Hebrides revival was in the early days of prayer meetings...

After three months of crying out to God, a young deacon rose and opened his Bible to Psalm 24 and read these words... **Psalm 24:3-5** (NKJV), "Who may ascend into the hill of the Lord? Or who may stand in His holy place? He who has clean hands and a pure heart, who has not lifted up his

soul to an idol, nor sworn deceitfully. He shall receive blessing from the Lord and righteousness from the God of his salvation."

He closed his Bible and addressed the Minister and the others who were still on their knees and said this, "It seems to me just so much humbug to be waiting as we are waiting praying as we are praying if we ourselves are not rightly related to God." And then he lifted his two hands towards heaven and cried. "Oh God, are my hands clean? Is my heart pure?" He then fell to his knees... something happened at that moment, in that barn through that young deacon that let a power loose that shook the heavens... it was then that an awareness of God gripped the community!

Becoming God conscience can be a scary thing because His light will reveal things hidden in darkness in our hearts... as the young deacon prayed, "Oh God, are my hands clean? Is my heart pure?" He was impacted... I wonder how willing we would be to ask God that question even today...

Prayer:

"Lord are my hands clean? Is my heart pure?"

Scripture Reading:

I John 1 Psalms 24

Worship Song:

Action:

Consecration is setting apart something for the use of the Lord... what would He have you set aside in your life that you may have clean hands and a pure heart? Perhaps it's your ideas of your future, or your ministry, or...? Lay them at the Lord's feet and earnestly pray for clean hands and a pure heart and watch what the Holy Ghost will do!

YOU ARE OVER HAIWAY FINISHED! WELL DONE! KEEP GOING 'CUZ THE BEST IS YET TO COME!

Day 12: Trust

January 23

1 John 5:1 (AMP), "Everyone who believes [with a deep, abiding trust in the fact] that Jesus is the Christ (the Messiah, the Anointed) is born of God [that is, reborn from above—spiritually transformed, renewed, and set apart for His purpose], and everyone who loves the Father also loves the child born of Him."

BELIEVE: GR: Pisteuo: "To be persuaded of, to credit, place confidence in the thing believed; be committed unto"

Romans 1:16 (AMP), "I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation [from His wrath and punishment] to everyone who **believes** [in Christ as Savior], to the Jew first and also to the Greek."

Galatians 3:22 (NKJV), "But the Scripture has confined all under sin, that the promise by faith in *Jesus Christ might be given to those who* **believe**."

This BELIEVE word is a POWERFUL word! It causes the power of God for salvation to be ACTIVATED, it causes promises to be RECEIVED, indeed ALL things are possible to those who BELIEVE! (Mark 9:23)

I like how the Amplified adds the phrase "with a deep, ABIDING trust!"

ABIDE: "To stay or live somewhere; to remain or continue" (Merriam Webster)

This trust doesn't leave if conditions are not deemed favorable... I remain trusting REGARDLESS! And if we look at the Greek definition of BELIEF, it indicates **an act of will**... "To be persuaded of, to credit, place confidence in the thing believed; be committed unto"

What am I choosing to place this abiding trust in? That JESUS is TRULY WHO HE SAYS HE IS! He IS the Messiah, God's anointed Son!

1 John 5:1b (AMP), "...is born of God [that is, reborn from above—spiritually transformed, renewed, and set apart for His purpose], and everyone who loves the Father also loves the child born of Him."

According to scripture, if I am fully persuaded, having placed a confidence and an abiding trust in Jesus Christ, I have been born of God, reborn and spiritually transformed! I have been renewed and set apart for his purpose! Do you truly believe and trust?

Prayer:

"Lord help my unbelief! Help me to trust in you more and help me to yield to you continually!"

Scripture Reading:

Proverbs 3 Psalms 28

Action:

Day 13: Revelation

January 24

"The yearning to know What cannot be known, to comprehend the Incomprehensible, to touch and taste the Unapproachable, arises from the image of God in the nature of man. Deep calleth unto deep, and though polluted and landlocked by the mighty disaster theologians call the Fall, the soul senses its origin and longs to return to its Source. How can this be realized? The answer of the Bible is simply "through Jesus Christ our Lord." In Christ and by Christ, God effects complete self-disclosure, although He shows Himself not to reason but to faith and love!"

-A.W. Tozer

The prophet Isaiah, when he had a revelation of the throne room of God cried out...

Isaiah 6:5 (NKJV), "So I said: "Woe is me, for I am undone! Because I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts."

Revival comes to those **willing to become undone** in the revelation and presence of Jesus! Seeing Him clearly can often times have violent repercussions on our preconceived ideas of who He is!

UNDONE: HBR: Damah: "To cease, cause to cease, cut off, destroy, perish; to be undone; bring to silence; utterly destroy; cut down"

The greatest key to maintaining a relationship with Jesus that lasts is cultivating a fascination and a captivation with Him... in doing so the Holy Spirit grants revelations of Jesus that often times result in my becoming truly undone!

Prayer:

"Lord I ask you for a greater revelation of who You are1 I am willing to be undone! I desire to see you!"

Scripture Reading:

Revelation 1:13-17 Isaiah 6

Worship Song:

Day 14: Mercy

January 25

Isaiah 53:1-10 (NKJV), "Who has believed our report? And to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed? For He shall grow up before Him as a tender plant, and as a root out of dry ground. He has no form or comeliness; and when we see Him, there is no beauty that we should desire Him. He is despised and rejected by men, A Man of sorrows and acquainted with grief. And we hid, as it were, our faces from Him; He was despised, and we did not esteem Him. Surely He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed Him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities; the chastisement for our peace was upon Him, and by His stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned, every one, to his own way; and the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed and He was afflicted, yet He opened not His mouth; He was led as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before its shearers is silent, so He opened not His mouth. He was taken from prison and from judgment, and who will declare His generation? For He was cut off from the land of the living; for the transgressions of My people He was stricken. And they made His grave with the wicked—but with the rich at His death, because He had done no violence, nor was any deceit in His mouth. Yet it pleased the Lord to bruise *Him*; He has put Him to grief. When You make His soul an offering for sin, He shall see His seed, He shall prolong His days, and the pleasure of the Lord shall prosper in His hand."

PLEASED: HBR: Chaphets: "To delight in, take pleasure in, desire, be pleased with"

Isaiah 53:10a (AMP), "Yet the Lord was willing to crush Him, causing Him to suffer..."

As a Father, I wrestle with Isaiah 53:10... to put my child in harms way for another, however, I am convinced one of the reasons why it delighted the Lord to bruise Jesus was the opportunity to reveal an aspect of His very nature: **MERCY**!

One of the intense truths of the cross is the violent nature of mercy... mercy is not a passive thing... it is aggressive and unrelenting! The mercy of the Lord put Jesus to grief! (Isaiah 53:9)

God delighted in, took pleasure in, He desired and was pleased with bruising Jesus because His unrelenting mercy could be revealed! He placed on Jesus the sin and inquiry of us all that we might be able to have fellowship with Him! God's mercy is within reach!

Ephesians 2:1-5 (NKJV), "And you He made alive, who were dead in trespasses and sins, in which you once walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air,

the spirit who now works in the sons of disobedience, among whom also we all once conducted ourselves in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, just as the others. But God, who is rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved)"

Micah 7:18 (NKJV), "Who is a God like You, pardoning iniquity and passing over the transgression of the remnant of His heritage? He does not retain His anger forever, because He delights in mercy."

MERCY (Ephesians 2:4): GR: Eleos: "Kindness or good will towards the miserable and the afflicted, joined with a desire to help them; the mercy and clemency of God in providing and offering to men salvation by Christ"

MERCY (Micah 7:18): HBR: Checed: "Goodness, kindness, faithfulness; mercy, kindness, lovingkindness; favor" (Used 241 times in the Old Testament!)

God's mercy is astounding!

Prayer:

"Lord thank you for Your unrelenting mercy for me! Thank you for brushing Jesus that I may have right standing with You because of His perfect sacrifice!"

Scripture Reading:

Ephesians 2 Titus 3

Worship Song:

Mercy

Action:

Reflect on the multiple times God's mercy has been extended to you! Ask the Holy Spirit if there is any judgmental attitude in your heart towards someone that needs to be dealt with and where mercy needs to be extended!

Day 15: Done in Secret

January 26

Luke 12:3 (AMP), "For that reason, whatever you have said in the dark will be heard in the light, and what you have whispered behind closed doors will be proclaimed on the housetops."

"Whatsoever is said and done in secret..."

A few years ago, the Lord woke me up at 3:30am with this. When I asked Him what He was desiring concerning this, he lead me to John 8:1-11. Now if you have been in church for any length of time, I am sure you have heard a sermon or two on this story... I have even preached this story many times... The Holy Spirit, however, began to speak to me on several different aspects concerning the verse of things being done in secret being shouted from the rooftops.

Adultery happens in secret... it is not a public thing. Those involved in adultery take great pains not to be discovered... but in John 8, this was dragged into the light. You see, the act of adultery is a symptom of an adulterous heart. We are masters at treating symptoms rather than curing diseases... especially in the body of Christ.

What is an "Adulterous Heart?"
An adulterous heart is a covenant breaker.
An adulterous heart is a betrayer.
An adulterous heart exalts itself above all else.
An adulterous heart submits itself to the authority and desires to another

What are some causes of adultery?
Rejection/abandonment
Lack of love/acceptance
Harshness or unrealistic expectations
Idolatry

Jesus allowed the discovery of her adultery that He might redeem her.

John 8:3 (AMP), "Now the scribes and Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery. They made her stand in the center of the court..."

God will allow the things done in secret to be exposed that He might deal with them... such is His love for us! He will also give opportunity to make things right before He has to make it go public.

John 8:7-8 (AMP), "However, when they persisted in questioning Him, He straightened up and said, "He who is without [any] sin among you, let him be the first to throw a stone at her." Then He stooped down again and started writing on the ground."

John 8:9-10 (AMP), "They listened [to His reply], and they began to go out one by one, starting with the oldest ones, until He was left alone, with the woman [standing there before Him] in the center of the court. Straightening up, Jesus said to her, "Woman, where are they? Did no one condemn you?"

John 8:11 (AMP), "She answered, "No one, Lord!" And Jesus said, "I do not condemn you either. Go. From now on sin no more."

The law collided with grace... and grace won.

Signs of an adulterous heart:
Emotionally distant
Angry, critical and even at times cruel
More demonstrations of control
Overly occupied with various activities/distractions
Paying extra close attention to appearance
Inappropriately defensive
Overly given to offense/looking for opportunities to be right

Do we entertain an adulterous heart in any way?

Prayer:

"Search me oh God... reveal any sign of an adulterous heart in me... have mercy and forgive any where I have entertained this in my life!"

Scripture Reading:

Intimacy becomes less and less

Hosea 3 John 8

Worship Song:

Killing Me With Mercy

Action:

Day 16: Impatience

January 27

Exodus 32:1 (NKJV), "Now when the people saw that Moses delayed coming down from the mountain, the people gathered together to Aaron, and said to him, "Come, make us gods that shall go before us; for as for this Moses, the man who brought us up out of the land of Egypt, we do not know what has become of him."

The Israelites had just seen the Lord humble one of the greatest nations on the planet through the 10 plagues, yet in their impatience, they create an idol...

Impatience breeds impetuousness (acting or done quickly and without thought, controlled by emotion rather than thought).

The greatest crucible for our lives is the wilderness... A season in life where there is spiritual, financial, or emotional drought. It can also be a tough time in which you begin to endure discomfort and trials. Often it can be a time of intensified temptation and spiritual attack.

BECAUSE OF THIER IMPATIENCE IN THE WILDERNESS THE CHILDREN OF ISRAEL:

- Despised the Godly influence in their lives (Moses)
- Looked backwards at the idols of Egypt and desired them (Ezekiel 20:8a)

Ezekiel 20:8a (NKJV), "But they rebelled against Me and would not obey Me. They did not all cast away the abominations which were before their eyes, nor did they forsake the idols of Egypt..."

· Forgot about God's deliverance and power and gave that glory to an idol

Will you begin to despise the Godly influence in your life? This is where people begin to stop reading their bibles, stop praying, and stop going to church. Will you forget how many times the Lord demonstrated His deliverance and power in your life? Or worse, begin to think that those things came from something other than Him?

Beware the snare of impatience!

Prayer:

"Help me oh God to trust in you and to be patient and wait for you and not act out of my own strength!"

Scripture Reading:

Exodus 32 Hebrews 10

Action:

Where have I entertained impatience in my life? Where have I acted impetuously? Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal these things to you and lay them at His feet when He does!

Day 17: Confidence

January 28

1 John 5:14-15 (AMP), "This is the remarkable degree of confidence which we as believers are entitled to have before Him: that if we ask anything according to His will, that is, consistent with His plan and purpose He hears us. And if we know for a fact, as indeed we do that He hears and listens to us in whatever we ask, we also know with settled and absolute knowledge that we have granted to us the requests which we have asked from Him."

On a continual basis, preachers rant and rave about the necessity of prayer... they scream "PRAY!" And as you probably have attempted to pray, asking God for something sometimes only to find your prayer goes unanswered. This is not a good "confidence booster" for prayer! John speaks not only of a confidence in I John 5:14 but a **REMARKABLE** confidence...

CONFIDENCE: GR: Parrhesia: "Free and fearless confidence, cheerful courage, boldness, assurance; openly, frankly, without concealment"

If I lack confidence in prayer, chances are I will quit praying!

"A very wonderful thing is prayer, yet it is not every man's prayer that is heard, but he that hath the life of God within him shall have his petitions granted because the Holy Spirit will move him to ask in accordance with the will of God."

-Charles Spurgeon

"A privilege belonging to faith in Christ, namely, audience in prayer: This is the confidence that we have in him, that, if we ask any thing according to his will, he heareth us. The Lord Christ emboldens us to come to God in all circumstances, with all our supplications and requests. Through him our petitions are admitted and accepted of God. The matter of our prayer must be agreeable to the declared will of God."

-Matthew Henry

James 4:3 (AMP), "You ask God for something and do not receive it, because you ask with wrong motives out of selfishness or with an unrighteous agenda, so that when you get what you want you may spend it on your hedonistic desires."

How do I gain this confidence? (I John 5:14-15 AMP)

- I ask anything according to His will which is consistent to His plans and purpose He hears me...
- If He listens and hears me I can be assured with absolute knowledge that He will grant what I have asked of Him!

It's that simple!

The obvious question then to follow is "How do I know His will and His plans and purposes?"

The answer is found in the very definition of confidence itself!

CONFIDENCE: "Faith or belief that one will act in a right, proper, or effective way; the quality or state of being certain; a **relation of trust and intimacy**" (Merriam Webster)

If I have no intimacy with the Lord, then I will be unable to develop trust... intimacy with the Lord is found in the discovery of who He is in the Word and in spending time with Him in prayer, asking to know Him more!

The more time I spend with Him, a confidence... a remarkable confidence begins to develop and I will begin pray with a new found authority!

Prayer:

"I desire to know you more oh God that I may gain this remarkable confidence in You!"

Scripture Reading:

I John 5 James 4

Worship Song:

Day 18: Whosoever

January 29

A common accusation the enemy raises against God is that we are an annoyance to Him... for He is FAR too busy to engage us at our point of need! Nothing is FARTHER from the truth!

Revelation 22:17 (NKJV), "And the Spirit and the bride say, "Come!" And let him who hears say, "Come!" And let him who thirsts come. Whoever desires, let him take the water of life freely."

DESIRES/WILL: GR: Thelo: "To be resolved or determined, to purpose; to desire, to wish; to take delight in, have pleasure"

This word is a powerful word... for it implies not only being purposed in doing something, but having great delight and pleasure in the doing! For example:

Matthew 8:2-3 (NKJV), "And behold, a leper came and worshiped Him, saying, "Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean." Then Jesus put out His hand and touched him, saying, "I am willing; be cleansed." Immediately his leprosy was cleansed."

This word used in this context is so telling of the character of Jesus... He takes great delight and pleasure in healing those who cry out to Him!

There seems to be a common misconception in the western body of Christ that the gifts and callings of God are reserved for an elite few.

The thinking seems to be ministers are these unique, extraordinary people who sort of walk above everyone in their special communion with God... and the common, every day joe just kinda puts in his time at work and attempts to be a good father or husband or whatever.

The invitation that Jesus gives is specifically to WHOSOEVER WILL.

Mark 8:34 (AMP), "Jesus called the crowd together with His disciples, and said to them, "If anyone wishes to follow Me [as My disciple], he must deny himself [set aside selfish interests], and take up his cross [expressing a willingness to endure whatever may come] and follow Me [believing in Me, conforming to My example in living and, if need be, suffering or perhaps dying because of faith in Me]."

You are included in whosoever!!

Prayer:

"Thank you Lord that I am included in whosoever!"

Scripture Reading:

Matthew 8 Mark 8

Worship Song:

He is Faithful

Action:

How has the Lord equipped you to be used by Him? Take a moment and write down all the gifting He has given you to touch the lives of others! Then, use them TODAY to minister to someone!



Day 19: God's Fast

January 30

Matthew 6:16-18 (AMP), "And whenever you are fasting, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites, for they put on a sad and dismal face [like actors, discoloring their faces with ashes or dirt] so that their fasting may be seen by men. I assure you and most solemnly say to you, they [already] have their reward in full. But when you fast, put oil on your head [as you normally would to groom your hair] and wash your face so that your fasting will not be noticed by people, but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees [what is done] in secret will reward you."

What kind of fast does God get excited about? Kind of weird to think about this when you are almost done, but the Bible gives a clear blueprint of the fast that moves the heart of God in Isaiah 58! When He is specific in what He is looking for, it is always a good idea to do it His way, regardless if it makes sense to my flesh or not... God's way is ALWAYS the best way!

Prayer:

"Thank you Lord for giving me the strength to make it to day 19! I as that this time of fasting and prayer will give you glory! You are so faithful!"

Scripture Reading:

Isaiah 58 Matthew 6

Worship Song:

Action:

Day 20: Justice

January 31

"God in his infinite mercy has devised a way by which justice can be satisfied, and yet mercy can be triumphant. Jesus Christ, the only begotten of the Father, took upon himself the form of man, and offered unto Divine Justice that which was accepted as an equivalent for the punishment due to all his people."

-Charles Spurgeon

One of the first things God brings to light in Isaiah 58 is "To loose the bonds of wickedness."

LOOSE: HBR: Pathach: "to open; to be opened, be let loose, be thrown open"

BONDS: HBR: Chartsubbah: "bond, fetter, pang, hands"

WICKEDNESS: HBR: Resha`: "wickedness (as violence and crime against civil law); wickedness (of enemies); wickedness (in ethical relations).

Merriam Webster defines wickedness as "morally very bad, evil, disgustingly unpleasant, likely to cause harm, distress or trouble." God is a God of Justice... as a matter of fact it is one of the foundations of His throne (Psalms 89:14). *Prayers for justice coincide with His heart!* We are called to "throw open the fetters of wickedness!"

Psalm 89:14 (AMP), "Righteousness and **justice** are the foundation of Your throne; lovingkindness and truth go before You!"

Prayer:

"God, let justice be revered in this nation once again! Let Your justice shine through the darkness that covers America!"

Scripture Reading:

Isaiah 61 Luke 4

Worship Song:

See A Victory

Action:

Is there an abortion clinic or an adult bookstore that you know of? As you drive by, pray for justice for the unborn, justice for the exploited... and listen to the Holy Spirit as He may speak to you... God is a God of justice!!



Day 21: You made it!

February 1

You did it! You made it to day 10! Look back at what God has shown you, what He has spoken to you... wow! Now get ready! Here are the rewards He lists in Isaiah 58 when you follow His blueprint of fasting:

"Then shall your light break forth like the morning, and your healing (your restoration and the power of a new life) shall spring forth speedily; your righteousness (your rightness, your justice, and your right relationship with God) shall go before you [conducting you to peace and prosperity], and the glory of the Lord shall be your rear guard. Then you shall call, and the Lord will answer; you shall cry, and He will say, Here I am.

Then shall your light rise in darkness, and your obscurity and gloom become like the noonday. And the Lord shall guide you continually and satisfy you in drought and in dry places and make strong your bones. And you shall be like a watered garden and like a spring of water whose waters fail not. And your ancient ruins shall be rebuilt; you shall raise up the foundations of [buildings that have laid waste for] many generations; and you shall be called Repairer of the Breach, Restorer of Streets to Dwell In."
